In light of Christ's love for us, we can work together to engage our community to care for and invest in our under-served neighbors.

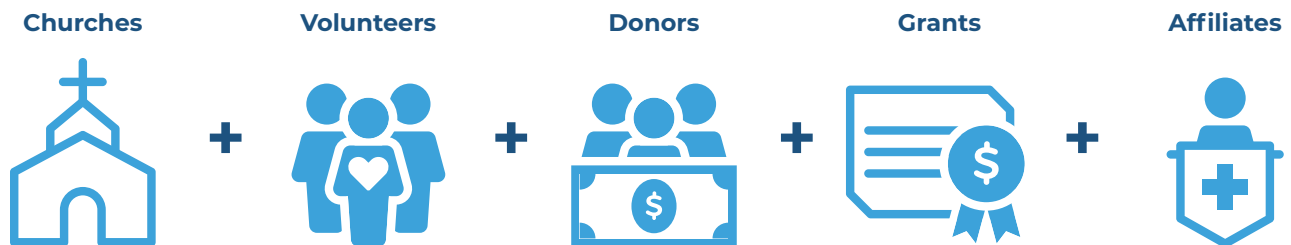

Deploying Surplus Funds

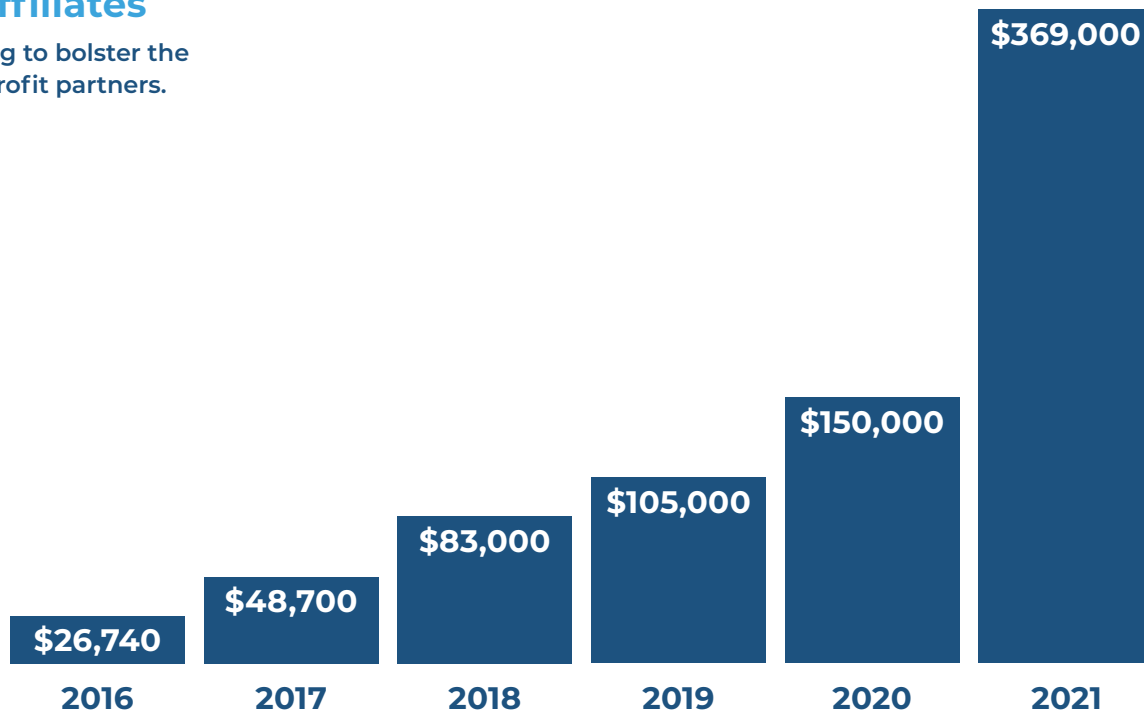
In response to the pandemic, Hope for San Diego was able to deploy surplus funds carried over from previous years in the form of emergency grants to affiliates, which resulted in this fiscal year's expenses outpacing revenues.

Reserve Fund

Hope for San Diego invested heavily over the last four years to build our reserves such that we are in the financially healthy position of having six months' operating expenses set aside for contingency funds. This financial strength has enabled us to invest in our affiliates even during this uncertain time.

Intertwining Funding and Volunteer Engagement for Community Impact

In 2019, Hope for San Diego conducted research with a doctoral candidate at Vanderbilt University who interviewed our affiliates and provided recommendations for bolstering our impact in our four key focus areas. **Findings show the key distinctive of Hope for San Diego is that our impact extends far beyond the financial support we provide through grant funds.** Our personal **relationships of trust** with our affiliates, our **depth of understanding** of and connections within our focus areas, and the **in-kind support** we provide through our church-based programs is unique compared to other funders and highly valued by our affiliates.

Our goals for impact don't focus solely on supporting our affiliates and their work, but also on working toward life change in our own donors and volunteers as they engage with our under-served neighbors. Our impact centers on the intertwined goals of funding and volunteer engagement.
